Presentation #1: The Interdisciplinary and International Health Care Research Consortium (HCTRC): An Overview (30 minutes)

An overview of the HCTRC mission, outreach and dissemination efforts will be presented that this Consortium has been involved with over the past 17 years. Outcome data of HCTRC activities since its inception 17 years ago and its influence on advancing health care transition research and practice will be discussed.

Presentation #2: Trends in Health Care Transition Research in the United States over the past 10 years (30 minutes)

The Annual HCTRC Research Symposium has provided a prominent venue for the dissemination of research and quality improvement programs for 17 years. As well, this Research Symposium has enabled the gathering and networking of health care transition researchers and specialists to share and discuss their practice and research activities to facilitate collaborative efforts nationally and internationally. The trends of research presented at the Annual HCTRC Research Symposium will be reviewed as evidence of the trends in research and practice noted over this period.

Presentation #3: The Quadruple Aim as a Framework for Organizing Outcomes Research, Programs, and Policy (30 minutes)

The Quadruple Aim, as an organizing framework for health care transition research, programmatic activities and policymaking will be presented. The alignment of the Quadruple Aim consisting of the improvements with population health, the patient experience, and the provider experience as well as the reduction of health costs with the field of health care transition will be discussed.
